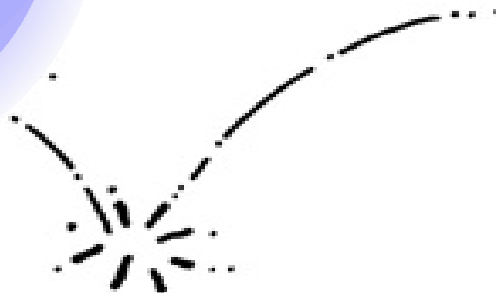


# Carry the Torch!

## Carry the Torch Challenge

The official 2010 Winter Games Torch Relay route begins in Olympia, Greece. The flame will be lit at the site of the very first Olympic Games. The Torch will then travel through Greece to Athens where it will be handed over to Canadian representatives who will bring the flame home to Canada. When the Canadian relay begins on October 30<sup>th</sup> 2009 in Victoria, B.C, it will mark the start of the longest ever relay across a single nation.

The Torch will be carried, flown, and driven across 45,000 km and through 1000 Canadian communities with nearly 200 of those communities holding celebrations, including Thunder Bay. The Torch arrives in Thunder Bay at 6 p.m. on January 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2010 after a fun filled day of activities and sports festivals. The celebration will continue into the evening with fireworks and a light show.

The Torch will arrive in Vancouver, British Columbia on the 106<sup>th</sup> day of the relay, February 12<sup>th</sup>, 2010. This marks the official opening of the 2010 Winter Games.

### The Challenge

- The challenge is for the school to “make it” to Vancouver in time for the opening ceremonies of the 2010 Winter Games by being active.
- For every 20 minutes of extra physical activity a class completes each day, they gain one community from the relay route. The school (or participating classes) must collect all of the communities before February 12<sup>th</sup>, 2010.
- Players use the transparency provided of the official 2010 Torch Relay route, to create a classroom map of Canada with the relay route outlined (or create a transparency using the map on the following page).
- Classes can work together by each taking a region/province, territory of Canada and combining them in a main area of the school to display.
- The classes can track their progress along the route either on classroom maps with pins, or on a larger school map with community signs.

### Additional Activities

- Players can use the relay route in math classes to calculate distances traveled from Greece to Victoria, around Canada and back to Vancouver.
- Players can use the relay route to help them learn about Canada’s geography.
- Players can use the relay route to help them learn about Canada’s cultural diversity and the unique Torch relay celebrations taking place.
- Players can research the history of the relay and present that information to their class or school at the end of the relay.

This map shows the general path of the Olympic Torch Relay Route and notes the communities and places of interest where torchbearers will carry the Olympic Flame. The flame will be transported by car, ferry or plane between the communities. The Olympic Torch Relay Route will be updated and further details including street level routes and timings will be added closer to the Olympic Flame's arrival in each community.
