

Toilet Use Procedure

Glove use is not required for toileting if you can do it without direct hand contact with stool or urine. It is not a substitute for hand cleaning, you must clean your hand and the child's hands after toileting. This procedure must be followed for each child in order to prevent the spread of communicable diseases.

- Assist the child onto the toilet if necessary.
- Clean your hands. Put on gloves if you will be coming into contact with stool or urine.
- Encourage child to wipe themselves from front to back and assist child if necessary.
- Remove gloves (if worn) and clean your hands with soap and water.
- Help the child get dressed (or diapered).
- Wash the child's hands with soap and water.
- Return child to a supervised area.
- If the toilet seat is soiled put on gloves, clean and disinfect toilet or toilet ring.
- **Remove gloves and wash your hands with soap and water.**
