

Providing School-Based Vaccines – Order Form

The Thunder Bay District Health Unit administers the following vaccines through a voluntary school-based program. In special circumstances, a grade 7 may require administration of the vaccine in your office. To improve the ordering process and make the vaccine readily available, the Health Unit will release vaccines for eligible students in advance for storage at your office.

In order to provide these vaccines, the Health Unit requires completion of **Immunization of Children (Ages 0-18 years) Report Form IMT-911** as soon as the vaccine is administered.

Hepatitis B 1.0 mL IM

Menactra Quadrivalent Conjugate Meningococcal 0.5 mL IM

- Two dose series if first dose given BEFORE 15th birthday (0 and 6 months)
- Three dose series if first dose given AFTER 15th birthday or immunocompromised (0, 2 and 6 months)

*HPV4 vaccine is no longer available for order in Canada; all doses expired on March 14, 2019. Beginning March 15, HPV9 vaccine can be offered to (1) complete an initiated HPV4 series or (2) start an HPV9 series for eligible students who had not yet received a dose of HPV4. This aligns with the National Advisory Committee on Immunization (NACI) recommendations which allow for the use of HPV9 vaccine to complete an HPV4 series, if it is not possible to complete with HPV4. Individuals who have completed their HPV4 series as of March 14, 2019 will not be eligible for publicly funded HPV9 vaccine.
