Ontario's publicly funded (FREE) immunization schedule recommends that children receive protection against:

2 months	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis, polio, haemophilus influenzae type b (DTaP-IPV-Hib) • Pneumococcal • Rotavirus
4 months	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis, polio, haemophilus influenzae type b (DTaP-IPV-Hib) • Pneumococcal • Rotavirus
6 months	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis, polio, haemophilus influenzae type b (DTaP-IPV-Hib)
12 months	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Measles, mumps & rubella • Meningococcal • Pneumococcal
15 months	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Varicella
18 months	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis, polio, haemophilus influenzae type b (DTaP-IPV-Hib)
