Pick your own fruit and vegetables for free!!

What is gleaning?

The practice of gathering produce that have been left behind after a farmer has harvested their crop. These crops would otherwise be left in the farmers's fields and ploughed under.

How does it work?



When a farmer has produce, they will phone the Health Unit to coordinate a date and time for gleaning.



Those who filled out a the sign up sheet will be contacted to confirm their availability for the gleaning day. Staff will arrange a bus to the farm and let you know where and when it will pick you up.

Gleaners are able to take home the produce they pick and keep it for themselves or share it with others if they like.





Participants will have the opportunity to pick vegetables or berries on the farm. Gleaners are encouraged to bring their own gloves, tools and bags/containers to carry their produce.

Who is this for?

This program is for families and individuals living within the Healthy Kids neighbourhoods.

Can I bring my children?

Children can come but no more than 3 children for every adult. Perhaps you can bring a friend to help share childcare or consider leaving your kids with a friend and picking for the both of you! Child care will not be available during the gleaning time. Due to regulations only children who are school age (3+) are allowed to travel on a school bus.
