 - Do not use alone
- If you are alone, download the Lifeguard app
- ✓ Start with a test shot/line
- Carry Nalaxone

Breakdown of Checks

Of those samples, 7 resulted as expected. Of the unexpected samples the following was found:

- Fentanyl and flubromazolam
- Fentanyl and fluorofentanyl
- Fentanyl and cellulose
- Fentanyl and erythritol
- Fentanyl and 4ANPP
- Fentanyl and caffeine
- Fentanyl, caffeine, and erythritol
- Fluorofentanyl and mannitol
- 4ANPP

Fluorofentanyl?

Fluorofentanyl is a synthetic analog (a slightly different form) of fentanyl. Like fentanyl, it is a pain reliever. It is often illegally produced and considered to be up to two times stronger then fentanyl. Fluorofentanyl has been found unexpectedly in street drugs like fentanyl. It increases the risk of overdoses and a greater dose of naloxone may be required to rouse individuals experiencing an overdose.

Consumption will lead to decreased alertness, pain relief, and decreased consciousness. It may cause euphoria, sedation, slowed heart rate, lower blood pressure, and lower or stop your breathing.

Can you over dose on Fluorofentanyl?

Due to it's high potency you CAN overdose on Fluorofentanyl. Since it is an opioid, NALOXONE WILL REVERSE IT. If you suspect an overdose, call 911 immediately, begin CPR if needed and maintain their airway.
